



Dear Friend:

If you are concerned about the dire impacts of climate change in addition to this pandemic, you may be interested in knowing there is a new, safe way you may gather signatures for I-187, the renewable electricity initiative. The process has been legally vetted and approved by the Secretary of State's office.

To get I-187 on the ballot, all it takes is 14,500 more legal signatures from registered voters. Add yours (preferably in blue ink) on two forms you print and mail to your county election supervisor.

Here is how you do it safely:

1. **Click Here To print the signature petition, and accompanying Declaration** of Petition Signature Gatherer forms on separate pages. These documents may also be below if you scroll down. (References to “affidavit” at the bottom of the petition “Sponsor’s Instructions ...” section should now be read as references to the Declaration which is replacing the notarized affidavit.)
2. **If you cannot print, Click Here To Request Signature Forms Be Mailed to You.**
3. You can read the full initiative text and shorter explanation at mtcares.org.
4. After reading, fill out and sign the petition using the signature you used to register to vote, write your county name in the line at the bottom of the petition and place your initials in the lower righthand corner.
5. **Check voter registration status by clicking here.** Witness petition signing by other registered voters in your household who can sign without risk to you or them of contracting COVID-19.
6. After all have signed the petition, complete, sign, and date the “Declaration of Signature Gatherer” form;
7. In a stamped envelope, immediately mail only the Petition and Declaration forms to your County Election Office (addresses are in the material you downloaded or sometimes at the bottom of this pdf if you scroll down). Forms must arrive in the Election Office before June 19, 2020.
8. Fill out “volunteer” forms at that tab on our website mtcares.org . Check the box letting us know you have signed and mailed I-187, then click “submit.”
9. Please be considerate of county and postal workers by not signing or mailing until you and your family have been virus free for 2 weeks.

We support I-187 because it will substantially reduce greenhouse gases, thus helping to reduce additional drought and severe weather impacting Montana farming, tourism, fishing, ski, and forests industries. By 2035, I-187 requires investor-owned utilities (like NorthWestern Energy) to produce from renewable resources, 80% of the electricity they supply, more if localities want more. It also doubles the current 50kW statutory amount of solar capacity that homes and businesses may install and increases that limit by 5 times on renewable capacity for governments, churches, and non-profits.

I-187 uses some of the savings resulting from the transition to zero-fuel cost electricity to replace the coal tax and royalty revenue that will gradually dwindle as we transition away from coal use. Hence, funding for Montana's schools, libraries, and other projects will be preserved without an overall tax increase.

From money saved by using cleaner energy, I-187 also dedicates approximately \$359 million for fossil-fuel worker retraining and assistance to coal-dependent communities.

We would be grateful if you would forward this letter to at least 30 your friends and family encouraging them to sign and mail I-187. Please help us address the climate crisis while simultaneously lowering electricity generation costs (with battery backup) to below 2 cents kWh, as is now happening in other areas.

Lester R. Brown once noted: “Saving civilization is not a spectator sport.”

Thank you for being more than a spectator. Let's not delay. With your help we'll stay safe and healthy while getting I-187 on the ballot to let the people decide!

PETITION TO PLACE INITIATIVE NO. I-187 ON THE ELECTION BALLOT

Subject to applicable laws and deadlines, if 5% of the voters in each of 34 legislative representative districts sign this petition and the total number of voters signing this petition is 25,468, this initiative will appear on the next general election ballot. If a majority of voters vote for this initiative at that election, it will become law.

We, the undersigned Montana voters, propose that the Secretary of State place the following initiative on the November 03, 2020, general election ballot:

Statement of Purpose and Implication:

I-187 generally revises energy and taxation laws, requiring investor-owned electric utilities to increase procurement of renewable sources like wind and solar, gradually equaling an 80% renewable energy requirement by 2035. Pre-2005 hydroelectric generation may only be counted if total renewable generation is 80%. Mandates may not result in rate increases beyond 2% annually. Cooperative utility members must vote on whether to voluntarily adopt initiative standards. To address reduction in coal-related mining, use, transportation and employment, I-187 funds worker retraining, pension safety nets, apprenticeships, and assistance for coal-impacted communities by levying taxes on each kilowatt-hour of electricity produced to offset coal severance tax, gross proceeds tax, and royalty revenue reductions. I-187 allows governments, churches, and nonprofits to participate in 250-kilowatt net metering systems, permits aggregate net metering, and the creation of neighborhood renewable energy facilities.

Fiscal Statement:

I-187 establishes new taxes on each kilowatt-hour of electricity produced in Montana, increasing 2021-2025 net general fund revenues a total of \$7.87 million to supplant declining coal-related revenues, and raising \$121 million by 2025 to retrain up to 7,200 workers.

WARNING

A person who purposefully signs a name other than the person's own to this petition, who signs more than once for the same issue at one election, or who signs when not a legally registered Montana voter is subject to a \$500 fine, 6 months in jail, or both.

Each person is required to sign the person's name and list the person's address or telephone number in substantially the same manner as on the person's voter registration form or the signature will not be counted.

Sponsor's Instructions to Signature Gatherers: (1) You must be a Montana resident. (2) You cannot be paid per signature. (3) Collect signatures **from voters, only one county per sheet**. (4) If possible, use blue ink. (5) Show copies of I-187 text to those wishing to review it. (6) **Do not leave a petition unattended; You must personally witness each signature on all pages you submit.** (7) Each group of (not more than 25) signature sheets fastened together must be accompanied by **your notarized affidavit**. (8) **Do not** add signatures after your affidavit is notarized. (9) Bi-weekly, **beginning 10/17/19, and before 5 PM, 6/19/20, deliver the original of each petition signature page** (even if not completely full) **plus your affidavit, to the election administrator of the county where the signers live**.
